## Round up of 2022




The past year has remained challenging for everyone with COVID still having a lingering impact but the sheer determination to provide our families with the best possible experience whilst on their journey has been so evident.

We totally understand that is a big and confusing mouthful, but put simply it means we are gaining more service user voices for our Neonatal families and we want more, we can only increase our numbers with support from all of you!! The East of England Neonatal Parent Advisory Group (PAG) is a group of parents & carers who have used neonatal services in the past. We represent the views and experiences of families whose babies are cared for in a neonatal unit and we play a vital role in driving forward improvements and changes in neonatal care in the region. We meet quarterly, usually online but are hoping for some in person meetings in the future. By using our voice at network level, we hope we can improve future families experiences of neonatal care across our whole network.



Our members care about families going through neonatal journeys because we've experienced first-hand what a difficult environment it is and recognise those things that can really support families during this time. We are passionate about Family Integrated Care (FiC) because of its power to improve not only the neonatal experience but also the lifelong benefits it brings for the babies and their families. We all experienced elements of FiC during our journeys and those were the best moments. We want to enable all families to not just experience elements of FiC but for it to be embedded into all of the care that they as a family & their babies receive. Ultimately, we want families to be recognised as the primary carers that they are and to truly be partners in care, fully involved in both the decisions about and delivery of their babies care. We want to partner with Health Care Professionals to enable this culture shift and this collaboration will bring positive results for both families and neonatal staff.

We are keen to build our membership, ideally having a PAG representative for each unit in our network. We welcome members from all backgrounds and experiences and who identify as parents or carers including mothers, fathers, birthing parents and non-birthing parents or partners. We are particularly interested in hearing from parents & carers who are from the following underrepresented communities: young parents/carers, working-class backgrounds, care leavers, those with physical health/disability or sensory impairments, and those from the LGBTQIA+, and Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities or traveller communities.

BAPM identified 5 principles and we thought it would be a great idea to look at each of these principles over the year and focus on aspects of the principles. This way it really gives each and every one of your ideas and the knowledge to change unit cultures into that of FiCare.

March 3rd 2023 FiCare Study Day showed 100% of participants feeling confident to practice FiCare in their units.
